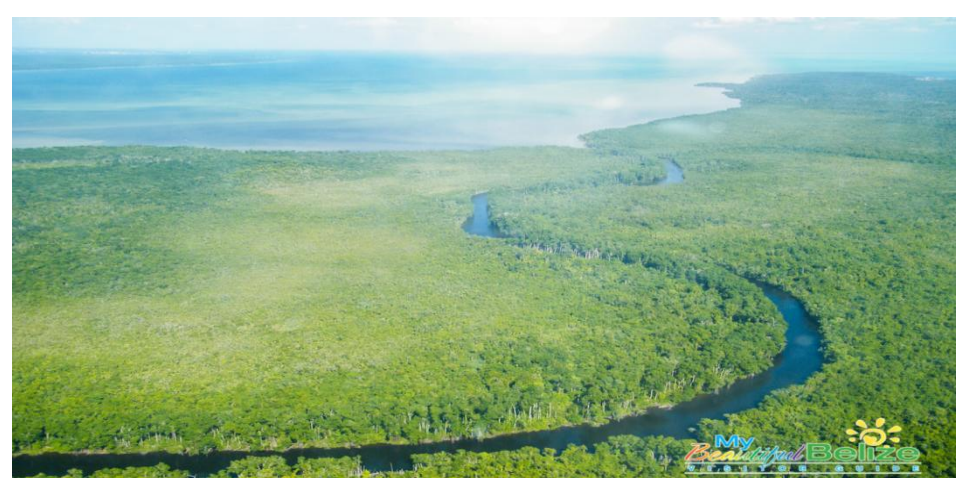

- the Mask Temple, adorned by a 13-foot stone crocodile-mask carving depicting an ancient Maya king
- High Temple, offering visitors a panoramic view from its summit.

# Ambergris Caye

The coastline is protected by the Belize Barrier Reef (largest in the northern hemisphere), a diverse ecosystem with over 500 species of fish, hundreds of invertebrates and over 90 varieties of coral identified.
